



Commercial Water-based Charter Boat and Tour Operators Task Force Final Report

September 11, 2024

Background



- August 2022 PRNR staff completed Board Assignment No. 22-015, where staff researched the development of a permit program for fishing charter and/or tour boats within the County water access parks.
 - In response to an increase in unauthorized commercial watercraft using parks and amenities as the pick-up and drop-off location for guests of private charters.
- October 24, 2023 Board requested that the County Administrator bring back guidance on a potential composition of a task force to investigate unauthorized commercial activity and delegation of authority for approval of penalty fees for unauthorized use of County parks.

Purpose, Scope of Duties, Timeframe



Purpose: Determine the mechanism for lawful and legal operation of commercial water-based charter boat and tour excursion operators.

Scope:

- Evaluate existing opportunities and requirements for commercial water-based charter boat and tour excursion operations.
- Develop final report and make recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners related to the purpose of the Task Force.

Timeframe: Two months (approximately June 1, 2024 – August 1, 2024)

Recommendations of Task Force



1. Implement Permit Program

- Task Force recommends that Sarasota County move forward with a permit program that will allow for the legal operation of OUPV "6 Pack" Fishing Charters and Tour Excursions out of our County Park system.
- Once requirements are met, these permits will be sufficient for both the County Marine Park District and Parks, Recreation and Natural Resources (PRNR). These requirements will set standards for professional and safe operation.

Recommendations of Task Force Continued



2. Issue Permits by Zone

- Task Force recommends that County issue permits by zones including north county, mid-county and south county.
- Businesses will be able to apply for the zone or zones that best serve their customers. Permit holders will have flexibility to pick up and drop off their customers at any of the locations within the specified zone.

Note: Task Force recommends the inclusion of Nora Patterson Bay Island Park within the north county zone even though it is located within the City of Sarasota and currently zoned for residential use. Issuing permits at this park may require the County to rezone the property and obtain additional approvals from the City of Sarasota.

3. Number of Permits by Zone

- The Task Force based the number of permits issued per zone on 50% of available vehicle spaces within each park. The total recommended number of permits is 124. These are broken down into 37 for north county, 48 for mid-county and 39 in south county.
- Businesses should not be able to purchase more than four permits per zone. Each permit represents the use of one vessel and must meet the program requirements.
- One year after implementation, the County should conduct a review analyzing the impact this program has on the park system to determine if additional permits can be issued.

4. Bid Process to Obtain Permits

- The Task Force recommends utilizing a bid process similar to what the County used for the Commercial Recreation and Tour Operator Permit Program.
- Minimum bids should start at \$1,200 per permit, per year with a term of three years with two additional one-year renewals.

5. Enforcement

 Enforcement is critical, and we advise the County and BOCC to take any steps needed to ensure the integrity of the program.

6. Proceeds

 Excess proceeds from this program after management expenses be allocated for the acquisition of additional waterfront properties to support the growing need of water access in Sarasota County. Commissioners: I'm writing in anticipation of your discussion on Wednesday regarding Commercial Water-Based Charter Boat and Tour Operators Task Force Report. I don't have financial interests in charter or tour boats and I am not representing the views of any entity -- just the comments of a guy who knows too much and cares too much about the Myakka River. **Allow me to make several points:**

The Wild and Scenic Myakka River is not mentioned in the task force's report, although it is by implication, since it references Snook Haven. I don't know if there are currently any motorized fishing charters on the Myakka, but there are two tour boats: The boat operating on Upper Myakka Lake inside the State Park, and the boat operated by Logan Tours out of Snook Haven. Non-motorized tours may be another dimension. (It is not clear to me if the County intended to include or exclude kayak tours in this effort.)

The task force proposal divides the county's waters into three sections, but I'm not sure the proposed section 3 makes a lot of sense. Sarasota has about 35 miles of bay waters, but it is close to fifty miles from Indian Mound Park to Snook Haven. Since the distance is so great and the conditions so different, I hope you will consider creating a fourth zone, with the Myakka being a zone by itself.

Furthermore, the list of recommended required permits on Page 3 makes no mention of any Myakka Permits. At a minimum any tour or charter operation that was not operating in 1985 on the Myakka would need a permit pursuant to Rule 16D-15.

There are a number of other state and county requirements unique to the Myakka in Sarasota County. These requirements are based on adopted goals of the State and County to maintain the wild and scenic resource values. Lax enforcement and increased use of the river are literally and figuratively eroding these resources and the tragic death of a personal watercraft operator during Debby highlights the importance of getting things right.


SNOOK HAVEN ADDITION: PHASE I CONCEPT PLAN
